Language arts: This week, we practiced reading and writing words that have the long /u/ sound, as in rule (bossy e) and bugle. We also practiced words that have the /v/ sound. We continued work with writing friendly letters, reviewed punctuation and capitalization, and combined simple words to make compound words. <u>Math</u>: We are back to adding and subtracting for a few weeks, but this time with larger numbers. We added using a few strategies to make the process easier. We looked for doubles (4+4), doubles plus one (4+5), and ways to make 10 (1+9, 2+8, etc.). We also added three addends (2+8+4). <u>Science/Social Studies</u>: We watched videos and read nonfiction books about high/low pressure and clouds. We are in the process of making foldable books to show the difference between cumulus, stratus, and cirrus clouds.

<u>Specials</u>: This week, Mrs. Pahk read <u>Children Make Terrible Pets</u> and <u>Press Here</u>. Mrs. Choi helped us design our own greeting cards. In honor of Day 100, Mrs. Bentz showed us how to use KidPix to make groups of 10 stamps to skip count to 100. Mr. Wulff taught us a transportation song called "The Yellow Bus."
