Pilgrim Stew 1 bag of frozen, cut string beans 1 bag of frozen sliced carrots 1 bag of frozen corn kernels 2 cans of kidney beans 2 cans of stewed tomatoes 2 large cans of tomato juice (on juice aisle) 1 small box of Minute Rice Garlic powder, salt, pepper, soy sauce, bay leaves, dried pepper flakes--season to taste.
