<u>Language arts</u>: This week, we wrapped up Unit 2 on Animals and began Unit 3, Things That Go. We practiced the sounds /j/(spelled j and -dge), /f/ (spelled f and -ff), and /ĕ/. We added -'s to a noun to show possession (i.e. Sam's shoe). We identified nouns and adjectives.

<u>Math</u>: We are relating addition to subtraction by completing fact families or creating our own fact families. For example, 2, 5, and 7 make 2+5=7, 5+2=7, 7-2=5, and 7-5=2. When adding, the greatest number is the sum (in this case, 7). When subtracting, the greatest number is the minuend (or the number from which another number is subtracted).

<u>Science/Social Studies</u>: In preparation for Veteran's Day, we talked about the different branches of the armed forces (Army, Navy, Marines, Air Force, and Coast Guard). We wrote letters to veterans. If your child didn't know a veteran, they wrote to one of my veteran friends.

<u>Specials</u>: We read about bears and bear poetry with Mrs. Pahk, continued our create-a-book project with Mrs. Bentz, and learned a new song, "Li'l Liza Jane," with Mr. Wulff.
