At the end of this email, I've included some of the lyrics/words to the trickier songs and poems. If you have a spare minute, have your child practice for you.

<u>Polar Express Day</u>—The kids and I thoroughly enjoyed this activity. Thank you to all of the parents that brought in materials, set up, and served the treats. What a fun day!

<u>RAZ-KIDS</u>—All of the students have received an overview for <u>www.raz-kids.com</u> now. Many have already jumped onboard, and as of today, we have logged 889 minutes of reading as a class. I told students that they must read a book at least two times before taking the quiz to work on fluency. Before long, I will start sending assessment assignments—students must record themselves reading, retell the story, and answer comprehension questions. The recording and results are sent to me. The only catch is that you must have a working microphone…ours in the classroom are not cooperating.
