At the Primary Team Meeting, we heard suggestions and strategies for integrating academic language into math and language arts to target Common Core State Standards.

We wrote a reflection piece about what we learned during the month of January.

Math: We reviewed strategies for adding numbers up to 20. We opened up the subtraction chapter by using a number line to subtract numbers less than 20.

Science/Social Studies: We were quite busy during Science Week. We heard a presentation about the All-Terrain Hex-Limbed Extra-Terrestrial Explorer (ATHLETE) from a JPL roboticist. Volunteers from the Wildlife Way Station brought in a skunk, opossum, and hedgehog. Back in the classroom, we continued our study of weather words.
