<u>Language arts</u>: We practiced the /r/ sound spelled with wr (as in write and wren) and the oi sound (as in boy and coil). We also practiced making inferences, constructing a paragraph with related sentences, capitalizing cities and states, and using commas in a list. For National Poetry Month, students are constructing Haiku poems about themselves with a 5-7-5 syllable pattern.

<u>Math</u>: We identified, read, extended, and created color patterns, shape patterns, and rhythmic patterns. Students can identify the pattern unit, which is the first group of items before you repeat (examples: AB, AAB, ABB, AABB, ABC, etc).
