Homework: Did you notice the lack of homework attachments? Congratulations! Your child is done with 1st grade homework! We did not complete the math problem solving book, so I suggest that you help them pace themselves through the rest of the book. Have them read 15-20 minutes each night. Buy them an inexpensive notebook so that they can continue journal writing. Also, look to Raz Kids, Starfall, MobyMax, and IXL for reading and math activities. These websites should be available over the summer break, too, so encourage your child to keep practicing!

<u>New website</u>: It is quite late in the year, but I just heard about a great website called MobyMax. It is at http://www.mobymax.com/. Students must search for their school (Palm Crest) and then enter their username and password (for most students, both entries will be their first name. For my Mias, Sophias, and Jack, you need your last initial, too.). We have played with it in class. What I like most about it is that it follows your child's progress and advances them or supplements content as needed. It has activities for math, reading, grammar, writing, and more. Check it out!

<u>Animal/Habitat Report and Project</u>: I am reattaching the habitat project just in case you need it again. Remember that it is due on Tuesday, May 20th. We have received one excellent desert habitat already, and I am looking forward to seeing what other ideas come in.

Zoo Field Trip: The field trip is next Wednesday, May 21st! Students will be All Day Birds that day (8:10-2:50). Please send them sack lunches with disposable packaging so that chaperones will not have to lug around Tupperware all day. Also make sure to send a water bottle and hat. <u>Language arts</u>: This week was heavy on the assessment side. We took reading inventories and wrote our spring writing samples. We also reviewed comparative adjectives (smaller, smallest), stretched simple sentences with how/where/when details (adverbs), and sequenced events.

<u>Math</u>: We used lots and lots of rice to measure and compare the capacity of containers. We used nonstandard items like spoons and mugs to measure (no quarts or gallons yet). We also wrapped up the measurement unit, and we look ahead to double digit addition.

<u>Science/Social Studies</u>: We read all about the plants, animals, and weather in the desert. Students showed their knowledge by creating a desert booklet and several desert-themed activities.

<u>Specials</u>: Mrs. Pahk read The Bicycle Man and helped us check out books for the last time as first graders. All library books will be due this Monday, May, 19. Mrs. Pahk will still read us a story on Monday, but we may not check out new books until 2nd grade. Mrs. Choi helped us use symmetry to create a beetle with water colors. Mrs. Bentz helped us explore Clifford games at the Scholastic website. Mr. Wulff encouraged us to use our bodies to explore space as we danced to different styles of music.
